

## Systical Quality: The Designs of Wiccan Sojourner


t a recent interview, Wiccan Sojourner, designer and owner of \*Bewitched Designs," modeled her handfasting dress for me. It was her most difficult project to date, taking nearly a year of revisions to complete. The dress, named "Cassandra", is accented with gold, and consists of a layer of ivory lace over a layer of ivory brocade. Though it's only one piece, the skirt is multi-layered and pools into an elegant oval train. Puffed sleeves trail into floor length wings. An off the shoulder scalloped neckline flutes out to a waistband encircled with a golden, Celtic patterned sash. The sash is held in place by triquetra, a Wiccan symbol representing the triple goddess.

Sojourner's handfasting gown, and the process she went through to create it, truly outlines two important elements of her designs; her commitment to quality and her Wiccan background.

Sojourner, a Second Life resident of over two years, has been designing clothing since June of 2005. After listening to friends complain about their clothing, which had flaws such as mismatched seams, she began to realize that some of the apparel she bought from her favorite designers were flawed. She recalled how the feeling of wearing less than perfect clothing affected her modeling career." It got to the point that when I modeled, I was upset if the designer was offering below par work, so I started designing for myself and my friends," she explained. She added that the idea of people paying a lot of money for less than perfect items bothered her.

Sojourner's main shop, located in Witchwood, seems almost surprising to her. She recalled starting her business by using free spaces lent to her by friends. "I was scared to death to rent," she mentioned. "I guess I never thought people would buy from me and I had no money." Today, Sojourner has over 60 stores located throughout SL, and she sells many of her items on SLExchange. She joked that one reason she has so many locations is that "it's hard to say no when someone asks you to come." Many of those locations are holiday locations, displaying ensembles perfect for this time of year.

Her Christmas outfits are also displayed in her main store. The "Snow Queen,"



one of the ensembles featured in the holiday section of her main store, is stunning and aptly named. It consists of a revealing bolero that is textured in silvery sparkles and opens down the front, displaying a glimpse of tantalizing cleavage. A floor length skirt in a complimentary fabric with a silvery tier skims the body. The "Snow Babe" ensemble, in pine, is a more traditionally holiday outfit, but equally sexy. Patterned in green snowflakes, the set includes a fur trimmed- Santa hat, midriff baring jacket, and tiny pleated skirt. Matching knee length boots are also included. Men aren't forgotten in the holiday rush, though. The "Holly King" ensemble includes a long, jacquard trimmed velvet robe, and matching belted pants. Accessories include a fur trimmed hat and boots, as well as a staff trimmed with mistletoe. Another Bewitched holiday specialty is the annual "Miss Claus and Sexy Santa" modeling contest. Winners of the contest receive a modeling contract, 500 Linden, and other gifts. The winners are judged not only on their beauty, but on their personalities.

These holiday outfits are just one type of the special ensembles Sojourner displays throughout the year. Come Halloween, Bewitched has one of the most extensive collections of costumes in SL. The "Buccaneer Beauty" and "Buccaneer

Brawn" sets, for example, are highly detailed costumes for women and men respectively. Both sets include everything a swashbuckler needs; pirate jackets, pants, belts, hats and swords all textured in a stylish black and white. The "V for Vendetta" set, which Sojourner calls her most difficult project to date, is based off of the movie of the same name. The set, which is for men, includes, among other things, a set of painstakingly created knives. The "Modern Witch" ensemble consists of layers of a transparent silver, cob webbed skirt and blouse layered over a bikini set. And of course, many accessories, including a pointy silver witch's hat, are included.

The "Modern Witch" ensemble is one of many of Sojourner's witch designs. She's a witch and a Wiccan in her first and second lives. She explained what being a real modern witch is "someone who uses her or his personal energy to effect changes in his or her surroundings." According to Sojourner, authentic modern witches don't cast spells, worship the devil, or summon demons. She joked, "There are a lot of people out there thinking the TV show Charmed is true. You hear them talking about destroying demons. Makes you want to smack someone." Sojourner is not only a witch, but was also born into a Wiccan family. Wicca, a religion like Catholicism or Judaism, has one rule- "Harm none." Sojourner explained that the religion is centered on the Goddess, nature, and balance. She explained that many are interested in becoming Wiccan because they dislike men. Men, however, are an important part of the religion because they create balance.

Sojourner does custom ensembles, as well as collaborates with other designers. Her husband, Shadow Weaver, created two impressive dragons he calls "Blackie" and "Percy" that are displayed at Bewitched. The two of them also collaborated on an extensive collection of skins; the "Skins of the Gods" for men, and the "Skins of the Goddess" for women. Both collections have an impressive range of tones, with many makeup choices for the female skins. Sojourner also collaborates with her daughter, "Sheltered Heart," who has a large hair shop, also located in Witchwood. Sojourner has created items for The Goddess Shoppe, and collaborated with Robin Wood, a real and Second Life artist.

In addition to costumes and seasonal wear, Sojourner also has an extensive line of less specialized clothing. She has created everything from scanty lingerie to pant sets. She also has a line of about 20 wedding gowns available at her stores and at "All Things Bridal," including the one she so painstakingly created for her own wedding. Sojourner says her plans for the future are to hone her craft, and also learn more about scripting. She already makes and sells jewelry and shoes, but explained that she wants to get better at "torturing prims". The "Bewitched" store at Witchwood is located at: Hubbard (108, 181, 148). •



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FALLINGWATER CELLARDOOR

Just a few days ago I had the distinct pleasure of meeting Fallingwater Cellardoor, the stellar designer behind "Shiny Things" and "Fallingwater Flowers." Known widely throughout SL for her accessories from shoes to jewelry she is also surprisingly well versed in the art of building. Nothing will demonstrate this more than her new sim, "Shiny Falls," which is due to open in the first part of December. Fallingwater invited me to her unfinished sim where I could already feel Fallingwater Cellardoorand see the unique charm that encompasses all that she designs.

**Bianca Darling (BD):** How long ago did you join SL and how did you find out about it?

**Fallingwater Cellardoor (FC):** I joined SL over 3 years ago. My brother was pestering me to check it out. I didn't think I'd be interested because I've never been interested in socializing online; but, I got totally sucked in by the building and it turns out I really like the socializing too!

**BD:** I look around and can see your talents go way beyond "Shiny Things," and "Fallingwater Flowers." I can't wait to see how it all turns out.

**FC**: Me too! Big builds are the most challenging thing for me. I'm not good at visualizing and planning on a large scale so I just experiment until I get it right.

**BD**: How long did it take before you started designing?

FC: It was probably spring of 2004. My first accessory creations happened because there was very little jewelry around and almost none that I liked. It was stupid stuff that I'm not very proud of; photo sourced, textured jewelry. But, friends convinced me to sell it and that's how "Shiny Things" started. It wasn't "Shiny Things" back then. I was partnered with a friend under a different name. It was purely a hobby in those days.

**BD**: So it's safe to say SL has changed a lot since then. What are some of the ways in

which the world is vastly different than it used to be, from a design perspective?

**FC**: The quality of what's available is so far ahead of the early days and obviously there's so much more of it. Back then you could make a business of really basic designs with no fancy shading, bad seams, etc. Now, even people just starting out are doing high quality work.

**BD**: Exactly. There's a drive now to be the best one can be from the start. I think this is what anyone should do who wants to enjoy their work in the long run.

**FC**: Absolutely, if you're doing it just to make money, you're doing it for the wrong reason.

**BD**: Did you have help or major influences in SL when you first started designing?

**FC**: I really didn't. I've always been a self-teaching kind of person. My facility with prims has just come from a lot of experimentation and practice.

**BD**: Where do you get the inspiration for your designs?

**FC**: Good question! I'm not a fashionista in real life by any means, but, I've always liked the sleek simple look in shoes and I've tried my best to get that look with prims, and that's a fun challenge. I never try to copy a specific style. It's more a general aesthetic that I go for.

**BD**: Do you find you get some of your best ideas while being in a certain mood, or do they flow more consistently?

FC: Oh they're definitely not consistent. Lately I've had a good run, but, I sometimes get blocked. I'd say the mood I'm in when things are flowing is "happy." If something distracting is happening in my life, or if I'm just bored and burnt out, things don't flow.

**BD**: Think about your favorite pair of shoes. How long would you say they took to design?



FC: My prior favorites were my "Lady Slingbacks" and "Zigzags." They took me five or six solid days of work, from getting the prims exactly right through choosing and making good colors. My old boots are a newer favorite and they took a similar amount of time; a little less because I didn't go color crazy with them.

**BD**: Do you make all of your own textures as well?

**FC**: Yes, most I make from scratch, but, occasionally I'll do heavy modifications of a photo sourced starting point. Lately, I've been learning to add shine to my textures. That's fun!

**BD**: Tell us about your shops around SL and the collaborations you do with other designers. Also, tell our readers a little about what they will find at your new "Shiny Falls" sim.

FC: I'm really lucky to have a wonderful bunch of talented friends here. Hosequeen McLean and I go way back. We collaborated on a hair/flower combo a long time ago. Hosequeen and Zyrra Falcone have been really supportive of me. The shop space they've given me since my business was small has been a great help. It's also nice when Simone Stern or Hyasynth Tiramisu and I can collaborate on a clothes/accessory combo. As for the new sim, I'm finally going to have "Shiny Things" and "Fallingwater Flowers" in one place. Eddie is going to have his store here. I'll give him a 512 plot and charge him rent. (Fallingwater giggles here mischievously).

**BD**: Eddie is your SL hubby?

**FC**: Eddie is my SL Hubby AND my RL Hubby. We never had a wedding in SL, but we met here and then later married in RL. We just celebrated our two year anniversary. I couldn't have found a warmer, more loving husband anywhere.

**BD**: Wow! I love hearing stories like that! Congrats to finding someone who you may have NEVER found otherwise! When you have time to shop, where do YOU find yourself?

FC: I've been to "Paper Couture" a few times lately. I keep going back and contemplating what to buy next. I think they've done some really original work. "Pixeldolls" is also a long time favorite of mine and I think I have everything "Simone," "Panache" and "Canimal" have ever made. It's great to have designer friends!

**BD**: Tell me about some of the negative aspects or difficult hurdles you face when designing in SL, either from a design perspective or from the perspective of the SL market.


FC: Design wise, prims are more limiting than I'd like them to be. I'm amazed sometimes at what I CAN do with them, but, there are many things I only wish I could do. As for the market, I've always pretty much made things I like and hope the customers follow and for some reason that's worked. Once in a while, there are some items I love whose sales have been disappointing. But, it all works out in the end.

**BD**: That's an important point I think, being careful not to get caught up in a trend or a demand that you don't enjoy creating, simply because the demand exists. It seems if you love what you create; you will enjoy your work more in the long run, and that will always be reflected in your designs.

**FC**: That's a good point as well. I hadn't thought of it that way. I do hope my love, for what I do, shows.

**BD**: By the size of your following and the attention paid to your designs, I would say many are aware of your love and excitement for what you do! It was a pleasure to be able to sit down and chat with you. Do you have any parting comments for our readers and your loyal customers?

**FC**: I'd like to say a big THANK YOU to my customers and supporters. That's about it! •

**Trina Noland:** Yes, I did some browsing. I love the design of the store.


**Nicky Ree:** The store was built by my friend Ace Albion.

**Trina Noland:** What inspired the design?

Nicky Ree: [Ace] asked me what I liked and I showed her my "Peranakan" house. I love water, open spaces, plants and wood. So I wanted something tropical and yet classy.

**Trina Noland:** You have definitely achieved that.

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**Nicky Ree:** I have to give a big thanks to Ace for visualizing what I like.

**Trina Noland:** How long have you been in SL and what brought you to this world?

**Nicky Ree:** Well, since Feb 19th of this year. My husband heard of SL and he suggested we visit this place one night. So, we both got our accounts and spent the first few days exploring the world. I must say I was very

bored in the beginning. All we could find were casinos and camping chairs. Then, I found the "\_blacklibrary" and met some nice people there. The rest is history.

Very aware of pacing customers, Nicky realized that we were chatting in the middle of the store. She recommended that we continue the interview in her office. She suddenly disappeared from my sight and within seconds, I was being transported to another tropical utopia. She announced the spacious skybox as her work area. As I admired the relaxing atmosphere, she pointed out that from time to time she simply enjoys skating around her work area. We headed to the upper level of her workspace. As I ascended the staircase, a massive and glorious swimming pool welcomed me.

**Trina Noland:** How do you get anything done? \*laughs\*

**Nicky Ree:** Well I didn't build the pool. I just bought it. \*laughs\* I just like having it. I need my water, even in the skybox. \*laughs\*

**Trina Noland:** So, how long have you been designing?

**Nicky Ree:** I started, in late May, designing for SL Fashion. But, I am a graphic designer in real life.

**Trina Noland:** You are a great talent for only 6 months of SL designing experience. Where do you get your inspiration?

**Nicky Ree:** Hmmm. Mostly, I get inspiration from fabrics. I fiddle in PhotoShop working on fabrics. Then once I get a fabric texture and pattern I like, I start working on designs for clothes based on the fabric.

Trina Noland: There's a great amount of detail



in your fabrics. So, if the textures inspire the designs, what inspires the textures?

**Nicky Ree:** Well I look at fashion sites, movies, and comics. Sometimes I just plain doodle. I was doodling "Isobel" the biker suit, doing swirls and abstract. Then, I liked the composition so decided to use it on the bodysuit.

**Trina Noland:** In one word, how would you describe your fashions?

**Nicky Ree:** Hmmm hard one. . .simple elegance. . .I guess


**Trina Noland:** Oh yes, \*laughs\* I'm stocked up with them as well. So, it's safe to say that you LOVE to shop for hair the most?




#### **Cold Comfort: Marlene Simon's "Sweater Girl"**

The women of Second Life wear wedding gowns to their weddings, swimsuits to the beach, and costumes to Halloween parties, so doesn't it make sense that we would wear warm clothing to go snowboarding?

The problem of dressing appropriately in snowy environments has found a solution in the designs of Marlene Simon, owner of "Sweater Girl." Simon, who has been creating clothing for about a month, explained that her practical knowledge about clothing comes from her real life occupation as an actress. She explained that as a performer, "you learn a lot about what clothes do for you or don't."

When it came to Second Life apparel, Simon said she wanted to create clothing that was "elegant and sexy, but in that order." She joked that it's "no fun if you are half naked all the time." The bold patterns and colors she uses on her pieces are the hallmark of her designs. Simon explained to me that she loves colors so she allows the "quality of textures and patterns to work so the designs themselves can be very simple." The "Pink St. Clam" sweater is warm and oversized, featuring a geometrical pattern that incorporates a bold pink, blues, greens, yellows and reds. The "Sunshine Africa Day Dress" is patterned in a bright kente cloth in yellow, brown and green. For those with the holiday spirit, there are several oversized turtleneck sweaters featuring holiday prints such as snowmen, bells, and Christmas trees.

Simon's customers are very happy with her work. For example, the pink, midriff baring sweater she donned for the interview was a result of customer suggestions. One of her customers has even started a group called "The Sweater Girls." Simon, who has just opened four new locations, is working on designs for men and a line of cocktail dresses she's promised her fans. Her main store can be found in Cass (95, 105, 56).•

#### Casa Del Shai

"Casa del Shai" has a warm tropical feeling. The palm trees that you see outside the windows give the intimate spaces the feeling of a plush, rainforest tree house. On a small deck near the entrance, there is a table with an elegant white umbrella and seats with comfy white cushions. The inside is natural, dark

wood and rattan, with enough white to keep it light. Shopping here feels like being on a vacation.

The building is divided into two "huts" separated by a wide covered passageway that's open at either end to let in the breeze. The

huts (and they are much too elegant to be called huts) present Shai Delacroix's current fall/winter collections, one for "Shai Girls," one for "Shai Guys." This is Shai's new store, designed for her by her friend Aemilia Case, and built to hold her growing fashion line.

It's sensual and comfortable, modern without being cold, themed without being a cliché. Much like Shai, (who when asked to describe herself in one word, replied "eclectic") diverse elements come together to create a harmonious but complex whole.

Dark haired with delicate features, Shai is warm and easy to talk to. She is often found in the store chatting and making jokes with customers. There's a cocktail party feeling, a cocktail party with well-dressed, witty friends. The friendly banter is punctuated by friendly business talk. "Thank you for your purchase," she says to one. To someone who leaves the jacket off one outfit to bare her tummy, she says, "hmmm, maybe I'll do some skirts like that." Her customers are loyal, "Although," she laughs, "they accuse me of hoarding when I hold back designs to release a collection." At her customer's requests, she'll soon be doing more accessories and there will be shoes, mostly sandals, in the upcoming spring/summer collection.

Shai's knowledge of her customers produces a coherent collection with pieces that seem to belong together in one's wardrobe. This produces "Shai-aholics" who insist on owning every piece. Shai says that a "Shai Girl is confident, adventurous, independent, and feminine without being girlish." A "Shai Guy is sure of himself, casually elegant, worldly and not afraid of showing his softer side."

Shai translates her understanding of her customers into beautiful, well made clothes. Her clothes are rich, rich in texture and detail, rich in color and fabric. The colors are not simple



or basic. They are layered earth tones with berry hues and colors from the sea. The only true pastel is featured in the "Prom Dress." A sweetly innocent dress that has an optional jacket dripping with lovely, carefully rendered blood drops; this dress was inspired by the horror movie "Carrie." Most of her clothing is not so shocking. It's comfortable, casual and highly detailed.

In spite of the relaxed and easy feel of her clothes, Shai puts an enormous amount of energy into her work. Her first collection, last season's spring/summer, was produced in just three weeks. All of her pieces are hand drawn. She avoids photographic processes. This handwork gives her clothing an organic natural feel. The clothes look elegant and pulled together but just a little rumpled as if they were actually worn.

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The fall/winter collection, which is her second, introduces some new pieces and keeps a few of the old favorites. The tropical resort feeling is still there along with cocktail dresses that bring back the glamour of old movies and some comfortable, beautifully practical pieces for hanging out with friends.

The "Boracay Sundress," an old favorite of Shai's, a dress she calls her "comfort outfit," is a standout. The dress is made of earthy colored, rust and gold spiked with a little red, silk jersey beaded and draped to follow the body. The simple cut features a plunging neckline and bare shoulders. The panels of the skirt are cut wider so the dress flows. This dress is the perfect, go-anywhere dress, and the perfect resort dress. Imagine a tropical resort, "an afternoon shopping in an open-air market followed by dinner and dancing, ending with a walk on the beach carrying your heels." The dress comes with bangles that fit without fiddling.

"Animal Fever" tube dresses cling to the body,

flow marvelously around the hips. The sexy front slit opens when you walk and sit. Like all of Shai's clothing the texture is so rich, deep and tactile. The dress comes in cowhide, zebra, giraffe, and leopard.

Casual clothing for women include skinny jeans, with the most amazing fading, tube tops, shearling coats with matching mock turtle necks, and cute, cute "Daisy Dukes." The ultra plush, cashmere sweaters have a belted jacket styling that makes them great partners for other pieces in the collection or one's own closet.

The "Nouvelle Librarian," like the cocktail dresses, harkens back to old movies. It's frankly glamorous and steaming with repressed, barely repressed, sexuality. Think Joan Crawford or Bette Davis. The elegant shear blouse, with intricate detailing, and sweet short sleeves, pairs with a leather cinched skirt with a slit that's anything but shy.

On the men's side, the "Professor," a shirt and pants set, pairs with the Academy Jacket to create an outfit that Cary Grant or Brad Pitt would wear. There's also a rugged, plaid lined jacket, and more great jeans and shirts. There's a shearling coat for men as well. It's as at home with you hiking in the snow as it is perched on a barstool while you have warming drinks with friends. The "Casino Jacket" is a little dressier but not stiff. "The Shai Guy is relaxed about himself, unpretentious (or willing to act so), rugged, and soft at the same time."

Shai is often in the store early in the morning and late at night. One late, late evening, after almost everyone has left, she turns to store designer Aemilia and says, "More space, I need more space." Already, she's outgrowing this new, barely opened store. Aemilia looks up, and they begin to discuss a second story. Stay tuned. •


